## **Character Analysis Writing Assignment**

Now that you have read "Three Shots" and participated in small group and full class discussions about the story, write a one-paragraph character analysis of <b>ONE</b> of the characters in the story.
Using this worksheet, choose two moments in the story where your character reveals most clearly the type of person that he is. Additionally, you should consider what these specific moments reveal about the character's beliefs about and attitude toward manliness and the difference between childhood and adulthood.
<ul> <li>Remember that a strong paragraph will have:</li> <li>A topic sentence that tells your reader what the main idea of the paragraph is</li> <li>Two examples from the story to support your topic sentence</li> <li>Examples that are supported by evidence (direct quotation from the story)</li> <li>A concluding sentence that ties the ideas of the paragraph together</li> </ul>
